The original concept for this film came from historian Elaine Robertson, forchair and current member of the Township King Heritage Committee and teacher at Kettleby Public School.

For a number of years, she has wanted to make a documentary illuminating the importance of local heritage from a student's perspective.

Financed by Township of King Heritage Committee, this film has been deemed a project of great significance.

Valuable resources have been provided by staff of King Museum, King Archives, Toronto Region Conservation Authority and many local residents.

"With all this support, the end result will be a memorable film that can be enjoyed by many for years to come," said Magro.

The students involved in this project are from the Achievement, Initiative, Mentorship (AIM) Group.

This unique enrichment program was initiated by Robertson at Kettleby Public School. Besides conducting research in specific areas in King Township, the students are learning about the production of a documentary and the work it entails. They are having the opportunity to work with a professional team on the production. All in all, this is an enriching experience for intermediate students.

The first-hand knowledge of local heritage has given the students an insight into the importance of appreciating and maintaining cultural and built heritage.
